

Syllaballistic Four – Homes and Residences

Below you will find the phonetic spellings of 20 homes and residences. However, the phonetic spellings of these 20 homes have been broken up into 54 phonetic syllables and sorted alphabetically. Your goal is to connect the syllables to rebuild all 20 residences. The number of blanks after each number (1–20) will tell you how many phonetic letters you need to spell the word. The parentheses () will tell you the number of syllables the word has. For instance, in answer 1 you are looking for a two syllable word that is spelt with four phonetic letters. If a home or residence takes two words to describe, this will be indicated in the parentheses as well. Every syllable on the list must be used, but used only once, so cross out the syllables as you use them. When you are finished, write out the English spellings of the words in the spaces to the right.
